## Summary of Findings for FY06 Semi-Annual (Quarters 1 & 2) Report

- There were 907 children and youth served in FY06 Q1 and Q2, compared to 1,233 for all of FY05.
- Proportionately more males (65%) were served.
- Almost one-half (48%) of children served were 16-18 years old, almost one-fourth (23%) were 19 years or older, 18 percent were 12-15 years old, and 10 percent were 6-11 years old.
- In terms of race, almost two-thirds (64%) of the children and youth served during Quarters 1 and 2 were Caucasian, and 19 percent were African American. Asian American and American Indian children and youth represented two percent and one percent, respectively, of children and youth served. Data was reported as unknown or other for the race of ten percent of children. Hispanic children and youth represented twelve percent of all those served.
- English was the primary language spoken at home for the great majority of children and youth served, with Spanish the next most common primary language spoken at 10 percent.
- Behavioral problems (64%), school problems (60%), anger/aggression (57%), criminal/illegal activity (38%), family violence/stress (37%), and relationship problems (37%) were the most prevalent presenting problems identified among children and youth entering residential programs. Parenting problems (68%), family stress (57%), mental health issues (57%), parental alcohol/drug use (27%), neglect (23%), and behavior problems (23%) were the highest percentage of family presenting problems reported.
- Ninety-two percent of children and youth served had identified needs for mental health services, and of those in need, the vast majority (97%) were reported as receiving some form of mental health services. In addition, approximately 10 percent of children and youth were reported as having additional unmet mental health needs.
- Forty percent of the total number of children and youth served in FY06 Q1 & Q2 were also discharged at some point during these two quarters. The primary reason for discharge given by programs during FY06 Q1 & Q2 was “Goals Accomplished” (41%), and the next most common reason was that the child or youth “Left without notice/AWOL” (17%). Twenty-four percent of children and youth had a discharge reason other than those listed.
- Twenty-seven percent of children and youth were discharged to their home with a parent or guardian, just over one-fifth (22%) were discharged to places other than those listed, and 13 percent of children and youth discharged to Supervised Independent Living.
- Eight-two percent of students in a residential program in FY06 Q1 and Q2 received a grade of C or above in Math, and 84 percent received a grade of C or above in both English and Reading. School attendance was 94 percent across residential programs.
- Six-hundred of the 907 (66%) children and youth served during quarters 1 and 2 in residential programs had initial Global Assessment of Functioning (GAF) scores available, and 358 had subsequent GAF scores (60%). There was a highly significant increase in functioning among children receiving services over time.

## **Introduction**

This semi-annual report summarizes selected performance indicator results for 63 residential programs funded by the Rhode Island Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) for Fiscal Year 2006 (FY06), Quarters 1 and 2. Results are presented for individual programs and across all programs for the two quarters, and comparisons are made to FY05 findings. When results are presented at the program level, a program code (denoted by the letters A-BK) is substituted for the program name to ensure the confidentiality of each program. This report is the first to summarize data collected at the individual level. Prior to FY06, programs submitted data only in aggregate form, thus making it impossible to track individual-level changes within programs. Only data regarding staff indicators continues to be submitted at the aggregate level.

A note of caution about the findings reported in this report is that the methodology of collecting the data has changed, thus making it somewhat difficult to compare across years. This should improve as all data will be collected on an individual basis in the future. Also, the number of children and youth served by each program varies considerably, and several programs served few children and youth during the two quarters. As a result, the findings for some indicators should be interpreted with caution because the percents may be represented by as few as 10 or less children and youth.

Data for the following indicators are presented in this report:

- Demographic characteristics
- Child and family presenting problems
- Child mental health needs
- Discharge characteristics
- School grades and attendance, and
- Scores on the Global Assessment of Functioning (GAF) scale.

### **Demographic Characteristics of Children and Youth Served**

There were 907 children and youth served in FY06 Quarters 1 and 2, compared to 1,233 for all of FY05. This includes children and youth who had entered programs before the start of these quarters as well as those admitted during the two quarters. As is shown in Tables 1a, 1b, and 1c, there were proportionately more males served (65%) during FY06 Q1/Q2. Several programs served children of only one gender. The relative proportion of males and females served during all of FY05 was comparable to these two quarters.

Overall, almost one-half (48%) of children and youth served were 16-18 years old, almost one-fourth (23%) were 19 years or older, 18 percent were 12-15 years old, and 10 percent were 6-11 years old. No children ages 0-5 were served. These results differed slightly from those for FY05 in which proportionately fewer 12-15 year olds were served, and a greater percentage of 19 and older youth received residential services in FY06. In addition, the ages of children and youth served during the most recent quarters varied by program, with only 10 of the 63 programs serving children 11 years of age and younger.

In terms of race, almost two-thirds (64%) of the children and youth served during quarters 1 and 2 were Caucasian, and 19 percent were African American. Asian American and American Indian children and youth represented two percent and one percent, respectively, of children and youth served. Data was reported as “unknown” or “other” for the race of ten percent of children. The relative proportions of these results are

consistent with those in FY05. In terms of ethnicity, Hispanic children and youth represented twelve percent of all those served. This is almost half as much as in FY05, where 20 percent of children and youth served were Hispanic. Although this may represent an actual change in the target population served, it is more likely that it is due to the differences in the methodology in which the data was collected across the two years.

Finally, the primary language spoken at home was English for the great majority of children and youth served (85%), a figure that was almost identical to FY05. For each of these programs, Spanish was the primary language spoken other than English. Four programs – L, Y, Z, and AN – did not submit data on this indicator in time for this report. Programs AP and AR did not have any new admissions, and therefore no data on this indicator for FY06 Q1 or Q2 is reported.

## Presenting Problems

### Children and Youth

Tables 2a, 2b, and 2c summarize the presenting problems of children and youth at program admission (including only new admissions, N=388). Behavioral problems (64%), school problems (60%), anger/aggression (57%), criminal/illegal activity (38%), family violence/stress (37%), and relationship problems (37%) were the most prevalent presenting problems identified among children and youth entering residential programs. The rates of presenting problems across programs also differed considerably, suggesting either that providers served very different types of children and youth or that providers may have used different criteria to identify child-presenting problems. Four programs – L, Y, Z, and AN – did not submit data on this indicator in time for this report. Programs AP and AR did not have any new admissions, and therefore there is no data on this indicator for FY06 Q1 or Q2.

Comparison of FY06 Q1 and Q2 to all of FY05 indicates that the percentage of child and youth presenting problems were similar across these two periods, with a few exceptions. There were proportionately fewer reports of out of parental control and hyperactivity for those entering residential programs in FY06 quarters 1 and 2 (44% vs. 33% and 22% vs. 13%, respectively). However, the percentage of children and youth who entered residential programs in FY06 quarters 1 and 2 who were reported to have school problems was proportionately higher (47% vs. 60%).

## Family

Family presenting problems reported for children and youth entering residential programs during FY06 Quarters 1 and 2 are shown in Tables 3a, 3b and 3c (new admissions only, N=388). Overall, the highest percentages of family presenting problems reported were for parenting problems (68%), family stress (57%), mental health issues (57%), parental alcohol/drug use (27%), neglect (23%), and behavior problems (23%). Once again there was great variability among individual programs in family presenting problems reported. Four programs – L, Y, Z, and AN – did not submit data on this indicator in time for this report. Programs AP and AR did not have any new admissions, and therefore no data on this indicator for FY06 Q1 or Q2 is reported.

Overall, FY05 is comparable to FY06 Q1 and Q2 with the exception that there was a decrease in the percentage of children and youth entering residential programs who reported a need for recreational activities (19% vs. 3%).

## Mental Health Needs

### Children and Youth

Residential providers reported that during FY06 Q1 & Q2, 92 percent of children and youth served had identified needs for mental health services. Overall, all programs indicated that there was an identified need for mental health services. Four programs – L, Y, Z, and AN – did not submit data on this indicator in time for this report. Of those children and youth reported to be in need of mental health services, 97 percent were reported as receiving some form of mental health service. Virtually all programs that reported a need also indicated that the vast majority of such children and youth were receiving mental health services of some kind. In addition, ten percent of children and youth who were identified as needing mental health services reported having additional unmet mental health needs. This indicator of continued unmet mental health need varied across programs, and was consistent with FY05 results. Overall, 68 percent of children and youth who had an unmet need due to the non-compliance of the child/youth. Finally, the results of FY06 Q1 and Q2 were generally comparable to those from FY05.

### Disposition

As shown in Table 6, over one-fourth of children and youth were discharged to their home with a parent or guardian (27%) and just over one-fifth (22%) were discharged to places other than those listed. Discharges to Supervised Independent Living (13%), Residential Placement (8%), and Group Homes (7%) were the next highest percentage of dispositions. Programs AA and AR both reported that no children or youth were discharged during this time period. Given the large number of disposition categories reported and the relatively low number of children and youth represented in some categories, percentages on this indicator should be interpreted with caution.

### School Grades and Attendance

Tables 7a, 7b, and 7c summarize data on school grades and attendance among children and youth served. As is shown, 82 percent of students in a residential program in FY06 Q1 and Q2 received a grade of C or above in Math, and 84 percent received a grade of C or above in both English and Reading. School attendance was 94 percent across residential programs, a slight improvement over attendance figures in FY05. These generally high overall scores might be expected given that youth are in residence at or near the school they are attending. Although there were some noticeable differences among programs in terms of the grades received by children and youth served, with some reporting less than two-thirds who received a grade of C or better in specific subjects, the vast majority of programs reported that school performance among children and youth was generally satisfactory. It is important to note that this data likely includes some duplicated records as multiple marking periods were included when data was reported.

### Global Assessment of Functioning (GAF) Scores

Global Assessment of Functioning (GAF) scores were submitted for 600 of the 907 (66%) children and youth served during Quarters 1 and 2. The GAF provides an index from 1 (lowest) to 100 (highest) of a person's functioning at a given point in time. Of the 600 children and youth from whom initial GAF scores were available, 358 had subsequent GAF scores available (60%). In addition, the mean average amount of time between the initial and current scores is 273 days (SD=279.3). The overall mean average for the initial and current scores was 56.0 (SD=10.4) and 58.4 (SD=11.6), respectively, with a mean average difference of 2.4 points from the initial to the current GAF score (SD=8.0). This difference indicates that overall, the average child or youth receiving residential services improves in functioning about 2.4 points (out of 100), a meaningful and highly statistically significant difference ( $t=5.67, p < .00001$ ). Tables 8a, 8b, and 8c present the overall mean and standard deviations for the initial and current scores, as well as the difference between the scores. Six programs—O, R, AD, AL, BE, and BG – showed a negative difference score from initial to current functioning. This means that the global functioning of children and youth in those sites decreased, on average, over time, from the initial score to the current score. Although there are no clear outliers among these programs that might account for lack of overall improvement in functioning among the children served in those programs, four of the six programs had an average amount of time between the initial and current scores that was less than the overall

average of 273 days (ranging from 37 to 255). Thus, children and youth who spent less time in a program may have not had sufficient exposure to treatment. Another factor to account for these findings is that the scores submitted are not discharge GAF scores and may reflect functioning that has not been responsive to treatments or services.

Findings from the GAF analyses should be interpreted with caution for several reasons. First, the low number of children and youth included in the analyses by program makes interpretation of such differences a concern. Second, GAF scores have known poor reliability (and thus poor validity as well) unless scores are “anchored” in specific observable behaviors. It is not clear whether providers within programs used behavioral anchors to rate children and youth, and whether these anchors were grounded in rating systems designed explicitly for children and youth, rather than adults. And third, program differences in functioning often have as much to do with the prior functioning of clients admitted to the program than the actions of the program themselves. For example, programs that serve “difficult” clients may have scores that show little improvement, where as those that serve “healthier” clients demonstrate greater improvement. However, small improvements among “difficult to serve clients” may represent a greater gain than marked changes in healthier clients.
